If we have not met in person yet, please let me introduce myself. My name is Eric Hays and I'm the new Lead Minister at Fremont Community Church.

It's been two months since my family made our way from Illinois to join the FCC family. As we look forward to the future of our church, I want to reflect on the changing of seasons.

In recent weeks, we've seen some rain, some trees are changing colors, and November is now upon us! Soon, we'll be celebrating Thanksgiving and Christmas. The signs of changing seasons is obviously upon us and it seems like it all happens so fast!

Missions Corner

Greetings from France,

We grieve for Afghanistan, one of our previous fields. The plight of many was brought home to us. For instance, I was contacted by my interpreter who helped during the Hospital Standards Project. One of the Afghan ILD Directors is stuck in Kabul with his family. These dear ones trying to leave are not lacking in courage or resolve to help their nation, but are afraid for the lives of their families because of their public engagement for change and truth.

While I recently spent three weeks in Haiti, the island was again hit with an earthquake. We felt the trembling, but no damage in the Northwest. Ten Haitian Christian doctors left our area in the North to help in Southeast Haiti, the epicenter. HaitiGO, the organization we work with has begun gathering funds to help. The reconstruction will be expensive for many needy families.

In Pignon, where Haiti Go is headquartered we had one of the best yet men's conferences for the six churches. Several missionaries and Haitan pastors team-taught the Sermon on the Mount. We could not have predicted the challenging questions Jesus's words would stir up. How do I forgive my neighbor who put a curse on my field, or burned my crops three times?

We also held a youth camp for 200 youth and taught from Paul's admonishments to his spiritual son Timothy. This was the first time gathering youth from all of the churches for a camp. Pray that they will want to be discipled, mentored by spiritual fathers and mothers, and become the leaders for the next generation.

The ministry to churches in France continues this fall and I am traveling quite a bit. Sept 20-22 was the first in-person Pastors Conference since the pandemic. Then I traveled to churches in Sens, Dijon, and Massy where I listened to and gave input to the French pastors and leadership teams.

Hiking Club



The Hiking Club meets once a month, either on a Saturday or Sunday afternoon, and is for people who enjoy walking and being in nature. The hikes typically range from 5-7 miles and most will be within 20 miles of FCC, though we sometimes do hikes about 30-40 miles away, like in Redwood Regional Park. We rate the hikes easy, moderate, or strenuous to help you decide if you want to participate. For some places, we have two levels of hikes with two groups—one shorter and flatter and one longer and more hilly.

Wear hiking shoes or other sturdy shoes and something to carry at least one liter of water. Wear a hat and sunscreen, and bring snacks and food to keep you energized.

Dates, times, and destinations for the hikes are sent out a month ahead of time through FCC's Church Community Builder system. Please make sure FCC has your current contact information.

In Memoriam

Tony Vuola was born on February 12, 1944 in Stamford, Connecticut and moved to Burbank, California in 1957. After high school ,Tony enlisted in the Army National Guard where he served for 6 years. He loved woodworking, became a carpenter and eventually started his own business, Vuola Construction, as a General Contractor until his retirement.

Tony and Jan met briefly in Burbank in 1959, but in 1960 went their separate ways. He married someone else and had 2 children, 6 grandchildren, and 5 great-

grandchildren. In 2010, Tony and Jan met again and married July 9, 2011. Tony was a full-blooded Italian and very proud of his "sauce and meatballs" which he made frequently with his new great-granddaughter, Isabel.

Tony was baptized at FCC by Pastor Sherman Williams and became a member. He loved the church and his brothers and sisters. Loved the hugs and the handshakes. He had a little whistle sound (more like a tweet) he would make - especially with his best friend Dave Gadd - people tried, but no one could imitate it.

Tony worked at FCC as a Building and Grounds Support person from 2012-2013. He did a lot of odd jobs until his knee surgery. After that he could be found sitting on the front steps, often in very cold weather, watching the cars to keep them free from break-ins. He liked being able to greet the people coming and going! Tony genuinely loved people.

Tony went to Heaven on July 13, 2021 from a long painful battle with Parkinson's Disease. The only scars in Heaven are on the hands that hold him now.

Katrina Seibert McCurdy was born September 2, 1938. Despite having a severe, life-long vision disability, she was able to attend UC Berkeley and major in music.

Katrina was working at the Orientation Center for the Blind in Oakland when she met Will McCurdy. Due to an accident, Will had lost his eyesight and hands as a child. Will and Katrina fell in love and married May 22, 1964. They had two lovely daughters, Emalee, and Cynthia.

Katrina gave her life to God in 1972. As a young mom, Katrina taught piano to children and worked as a paid organist at churches in Oakland. She also became a medical transcriptionist for hospitals, followed by 25 years of Federal service for the Department of Veterans Affairs. She also remained active in the blind community all her life, serving on many boards and committees and attending state and national conventions.

In 1982, Katrina, Will and Cyndi were hit by a car while walking on the sidewalk of their block. This caused life-altering injuries for Katrina. She was no longer able to do most of the hobbies she enjoyed, but persevered, making the best of it.

Katrina enjoyed her years at Fremont Community Church, singing in the choir and attending the Ambassadors' Bible Class with other older members. In her last years, she lived with her daughter, Cyndi, and family in Manteca, and on July 19, 2021 in Stockton, she went home to be with the Lord. She was 82.



















